



CASTLES NEAR ABERDEEN











During the day this double-height space operates as a charming café, with the additional benefit of a tapas menu that accompanies its lunchtime mainstays, like sandwiches and soups. In the evening Cafe 52 is transformed into a candle-lit bustling bistro serving plates of modern British food. With a line-up that changes weekly to reflect seasonality and availability you can never be sure what you'll get, but recent dishes have included chicken liver pate with peached fruits and toasted ciabatta, and pan-fried Scottish herring with heroty to matoes. Café 52



Angus & Ale

Who doesn't love a good old juicy burger? But this is not just any burger! Made with the finest, homegrown Aberdeen Angus beef, Angus & Ale burgers are extra delicious and mouth-watering. Pair it with some of the finest cold craft beers produced in the region and you've got the perfect combination for a true Aberdeen meal. Share snaps of your burger of choice using #angusandale.



IX Restaurant

Housed within The Chester Hotel, a four-star spot on the fringes of city centre, this Aberdeen restaurant serves up plates of theatrical food in a refined setting. There are monthly-changing menus to make use of the best ingredients at the time and there's a Josper charcoal oven and grill for steaks (which are pretty constant on each month's menu). Start with langoustine paired with smoked haddock espuma, leeks and potatoes (a riff on a Cullen skink, if you will), and if you can resist the allure of charcoal-cooked steak then plump for dishes like beef cheeks with mushroom gratin and hasselback potatoes or halibut with clams, mussels and chorizo

Namaste Delhi 64 Bridge Street Aberdeen

Authentic Indian food served in a welcoming tapas style, Namaste Delhi is situated in the heart of Aberdeen city centre and is quite a new addition to the city's foodie scene. Tuck into the highest quality but value tapas which is healthy and nutritious, without compromising on flavour. Which dish will be your favourite?



Moonfish Café

This pretty bistro tucked away down one of Aberdeen's oldest streets makes a comfortable and convivial setting for an evening out with friends. Bedecked with wooden bent-back chairs and cool grey wood-panelled walls, this has to be one of the city's chicest restaurants. The Michelin-recommended menu at Moonfish Cafe has a seafood focus and uses the very best local ingredients for plates that are packed with flavour. At £55 for an eight-course tasting menu, it doesn't offer bad value and if you prefer there is an accomplished main menu showcasing dishes such as curried monkfish with aubergine or sirloin of beef with fermented enoki. Two courses from this section will set you back £30 or add pudding for $\pounds6$ more.



Food Story 13-15 Thistle Street, Aberdeen

Fancy an eco-friendly vegan foodie adventure? Food Story Café is not only a lovely little place to tuck into some incredible plant-based dishes, but is somewhere where you'll feel part of a community through arts and crafts workshops and bi-monthly reggae music nights. Alongside its varied menu for all food preferences, the café itself was built from recycled furniture and salvaged parts, giving it a homely and cosy feel.



The Silver Darling

It comes as no surprise that Aberdeen has a whole clutch of seafood restaurants when you consider its seaside location. With its waterfront views The Silver Darling makes a beautiful location for a special meal, just remember to reserve a window seat. The menu galivants around the globe - Thai fishcakes here, prawn linguine there – so there's a good amount of variety to suit nearly every diner. There are even options for those who don't eat fish, you could try the slow roasted belly pork which is rolled with herbs and braised with apples and cider before being served with buttered spuds, greens, gravy and crackling.



Bhan Thai

You might not expect to see a Thai takeaway in a round-up of Aberdeen's best restaurants, but we hope we're in a safe space when we say finding a good Friday night feed to enjoy in the comfort of your own home can be quite the challenge. All the favourites are present and correct – pad Thai, mussaman curry, jungle pork – as well as a few Chinese crowd-pleasers. Be warned, this spot is popular so you might have to wait a while for your food, but when you get your mitts on it, it will be salty and satisfying, packed with crunchy veg, well-cooked meat or fish and slathered in addictive combinations of Thai flavours.



Rustico

Rustico in name and rustic in nature, this homely trattoria isn't trying to be modern or cutting-edge, but it's in this that its charm lies. Staff are warm and friendly while the menu recounts familiar Italian favourites: bruschetta, caprese salads, calamari fritti and a whole host of pastas. Everything is homemade, down to the biscotti that accompanies your hot drink, and there are regular specials to look out for – like lobster spaghetti.



Nargile

Turkish restaurant-here's where to head when you need a hummus fix. Interiors are a little dated, but clean and comfortable, and if you aren't here for the instagrammin' then you'll be happy as a clam tucking into dishes like spicy chicken wings with yogurt and garlic sauce or one of their kebab choices that are served with rice, salad and sauce (and a side of fries, should the fancy take you). There's are good vegetarian and fish sections, making this ideal for a mixed group of diners - plus the more people, the more mezze you can share. No brainer.



Kamoon Kitchen

Expect a warm Lebanese welcome at this small but inviting neighbourhood restaurant. Freshly made dishes showcase plenty of veg and fragrant herbs in dishes like traditional stuffed vine leaves or fattoush salad made with tomato, cucumber, olives and crispy Lebanese bread. It's good news for carb-fans here too, with pastries being a speciality. Choose from a selection of sweet and savoury, perhaps starting with halloumi cheese and parsley before treating yourself to a box of baklava to take home.



Cogito on the Corner

With no-less than four outposts, we think Cognito can safely be classified as a mini-chain. Each of its locations offer something different (one's a café and another is a deli, for instance), so despite the grouping there's no one-size-fits all approach here. The menu at this particular venue is packed with comfort food: haggis bon bons, burgers, roast chicken and even knickerbocker glory ice cream sundaes. Interiors are as comforting as the menu, with candlelit tables surrounded by upholstered dining chairs, while staff are fun and friendly, making for an all-round pretty perfect package.



Wild Ginger

Touted by some as the best Indian in Aberdeen, Wild Ginger happily combines delicious dishes with friendly and knowledgeable service. We'd head straight for the house specialities section of the menu where dishes like tandoori garlic chilli chicken or relish lamb feature, but if you're after a classic butter chicken or biryani, then those are all in attendance too. Round everything off with a generous serving of rice, naan and saag aloo for a proper family feast.



Mi Amore

This cosy trattoria does a good line in comforting classics, with enjoyable results. Let the menu lead you from antipasto and pasta through to risotto and fish dishes: Perhaps start with deep fried mozzarella before tucking into a lobster ravioli. You must be tactical, too, leaving room for pudding time when you'll be able to treat yourself to homemade tiramisu or panna cotta. There's a reasonable pre-theatre menu, making it a really good place to take the whole gang, with 2 courses of popular picks like calamari and chicken Milanese served for £14.95 per person.



There are mismatched colourful tablecloths, parasols hanging from the ceiling and gold walls that add up to a pretty eclectic scene. It's this fun and lively atmosphere that adds to the experience though, and the food is as pretty and punchy as the décor. Portions are huge, prices are cheap, and the ingredients used are fresh and vibrant. They're whipped up into classic Thai dishes like satay starters and roast pork and sticky rice wraps or Pad Thai, as well as more adventurous-sounding meals like kaeng mus-mun andmoo dad diaw. Whatever you end up ordering make sure to save room for a dessert of bananas and sticky rice or a piece of pandan layer cake.

A sibling to Nargile, this subsequent opening from the same team serves up equally-as-good food in a slightly smarter setting. Kick things off with an easy order: mezze. The kitchen will present your table with a whole host of little dishes and dips all accompanied by hot pitta breads. For mains you could try the king prawns poached in a tomato and herb sauce with feta cheese or one of the house kebabs - all marinated and skewered with onions and peppers. For all out indulgence we suggest the steak and prawn combo.



Vovem Meat & Liquor 254 Union St, Aberdeen AB10 1TN

Who doesn't love a steakhouse and bar? Well Vovem Meat & Liquor is just that. Not only do they serve up succulent steaks, Loch Fyne oysters and charcuterie boards, but Vovem boasts their very own secret bar. Speakeasy 21 Crimes is Aberdeen's first 'secret bar' and even requires a password to get in. Located within Vovem on Union Street it is an exclusive and elusive bar that features a distinct vintage-style interior.
